

## Regular Meetings

The Committee sponsors monthly meetings (usually with dinner) at which experts discuss current international issues. The meetings are characterized by a wide variety of high-quality speakers drawn from the policy-making, diplomatic, and policy-intellectual communities.

While meetings are reserved for members and guests and are “not for attribution,” the Committee shares its speakers with local media, corporations, educational institutions, and other civic organizations when appropriate.

## Networking

Free access to the American Committees on Foreign Relations News Group: a daily distribution of important domestic and international newspaper/magazine articles, intelligence reports, analytical studies, opinion pieces, etc.
